



HISTORICAL CONTEXT 1987 INCIDENT



- •8 Asian American students, 4 male and 4 female identified students set out to attend an off campus semi-formal.
- •On the bus ride to the formal, the students realized they were being spit on with chewing tobacco by a group of white male students
- •The hostility continued at the formal, to the point where some of the students hid in a closet
- Upon returning to the campus, the students sought help from the UConn and Bolton police, but to no availno arrests or actions were made
- •The students turned to a professor, Dr. Paul Bock, to get support and help
- •After years of protests from students, and advocacy from faculty and staff the AsACC opened in 1993


The AsACC provides a supportive environment for students, faculty, and staff that encourages academic excellence, personal development, community engagement, and professional leadership.
